



The Action Ministries SuperPack program was extended into Action Ministries Regional Hunger Relief program areas to help ensure that local students facing hunger have the food they need to learn and grow.



More than 1 million children in Georgia qualify for free or reduced-price meals through the National School Lunch Program and the National School Breakfast Program. For many of these children, school meals may be the only food they eat during the day. What happens when they go home over the weekend?

Action Ministries SuperPack Program

The concept is simple: Children at risk of hunger over the weekend receive a bag of food that can easily and discreetly fit into a backpack on a Thursday or Friday afternoon or before a long holiday. The food is child-friendly, nutritionally balanced, nonperishable and easy to prepare. By working with volunteers from churches, businesses, clubs and local neighborhoods, the food is picked up at the Action Ministries Regional Hunger Relief Office and distributed to children in need at partnering schools.

At \$2 per bag, each pack offers enough food that children can easily assemble into six meals over the weekend. One bag includes two breakfast items, four protein-rich entrees and two snacks, fruits or vegetables. The menu changes frequently as food items are dependent on availability.
